What to expect

On the day of your visit, full details are taken about the problem causing the issue(s) together with information about the pregnancy, delivery and family health.

The baby's carer is asked to undress the baby down to the nappy and Maria or Yvette together with a senior student will examine the baby to try to find the cause of the issue(s). We will discuss what we have found and where appropriate will suggest which type of treatment will be suitable.

Treatment of babies is very gentle and they often relax and sleep well afterwards.
