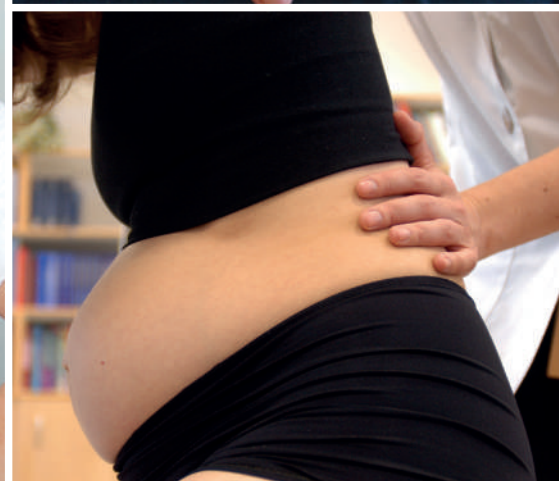
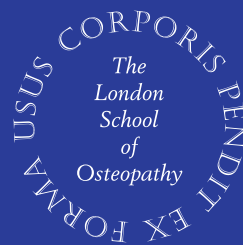

Flexible Career

There are both full-time and part-time options, with the flexibility to move between them if your circumstances change. Even clinic placements at our teaching clinic are flexible with the part-time route.



Both pathways enable students with no previous experience to transition to become a fully fledged independent practitioner.

Both pathways are accredited by the General Osteopathic Council and validated by Anglia Ruskin University.

All students join the course on the MOst pathway, but may transfer to the BOst pathway in the final part of the course. The level of academic achievement required for the MOst is higher (Masters level) than the BOst.

Varied Career

There are many facets of osteopathy that you may choose to develop as your career progresses. Examples include specialising in working with children or the elderly, in sports and rehabilitation, or in teaching or research.



The LSO is known for its excellence in osteopathic education, attracting mature students from all over the UK and Europe. It has been offering vocational training since 1948, and degree programmes since 1993.

The LSO programmes are staffed by highly qualified and committed individuals creating a dynamic, exciting, research-driven learning and teaching environment.

Courses start in September, and class-based teaching finishes in May/June. The clinic is open all year round. Students are required to undertake some clinic activities and a workshop over the summer period.

Full Time

Two semesters per year for class based teaching, with some summer school activities.

An MOst takes 4 years to complete.
A BOst takes 3.5 years.

An increasing commitment to the LSO clinic, starting with 100 hours in year 1, rising to 600 hours in the final year.

Visits to dissection labs in yrs 1 & 2.

Part Time

18 teaching weekends (Sat & Sun) per year.

5 or 6 years depending on pathway.

An increasing commitment to the LSO clinic, starting with 50 hours in year 1, rising to 400 hours in the final year.

Visits to dissection labs twice a year in years 1 and 2 (outside of weekends).

Course Content

The LSO courses are well established and are constantly updated to reflect advances in the profession. They contain exactly what you need to become an independent practicing osteopath.

Your journey will incorporate basic and applied sciences, including anatomy, physiology, pathology, pharmacology, philosophy, psychology and sociology. Your osteopathic learning starts right from day one, and a wide range of and is enhanced by integration in the clinic from year 1.

Research is an integral part of any degree, and is particularly relevant to an emerging health profession. Students are encouraged to select something of personal interest, to be supported and developed through the final stages of the course. Underpinning the academic learning are personal and professional skills, such as communication, problem solving, analysis, critical reflection, and self awareness. Business skills are also a core aspect of the course.
