Overall responsibilities	The post holder will be responsible for the operational and professional effectiveness of the LSO clinic as a learning environment for student practitioners and for the management and care of patients.
Key tasks	<p>To assist students to acquire, consolidate and develop the practice capabilities in accordance with the validated pathway, and the practice standards set out by the statutory body (GOsC).</p> <p>To accept responsibility for the interventions with patients, whether made by themselves or made by designated students.</p> <p>To deliver and contribute to regular clinic-based tutorials, critical appraisal and other teaching activities, promoting an active and supportive learning culture.</p> <p>To supervise and undertake student assessment activities in compliance with course and college regulations including the provision of appropriate feedback.</p> <p>To communicate effectively through oral, electronic and written media with staff, students and patients. This includes receiving and responding to communication in a timely manner, ensuring that information is passed to relevant parties, and generating effective records.</p> <p>To continue to develop, both as an osteopath and as a clinical educator, and respond to challenges and changes in professional practice, and to participate in structured staff appraisal and staff development activities.</p> <p>To contribute to team working and step into the role of team leader as required.</p> <p>To act as an exemplar of professionalism and inclusive ethical behaviour, including maintaining boundaries and acting with candour when appropriate.</p> <p>To attend and participate in meetings as necessary.</p> <p>To undertake other tasks as required from time to time.</p>
Essential attributes	<p>Degree or diploma qualification in osteopathy</p> <p>Full registration with the GOsC and compliance with OPS.</p> <p>Minimum of 3 years in practice as an osteopathic practitioner.</p> <p>Teaching qualification or working towards membership of the HEA.</p>
